














A private tour of the Presidential Palace allowed us the unique opportunity to be photographed behind the President's desk!















This is Teatro Colón's set and costume workshop.

general public.











all over the world.






























































Wine tasting at Norton, Mendoza, rated "One of the world's greatest wineries."


